“The revelation by Sicelo Shicheka, minister of co-operative governance and traditional affairs, that 280 white ratepayers’ associations, who are placing their money for municipal services in private trust accounts, are to blame for the ANC municipalities not being able to fulfill their service delivery obligations, speaks volumes” says Rev Theunis Botha of the Christian Democratic Party (CDP) and Acting chair of the Christian Democratic Alliance (CDA).

“The question Shicheka should ask himself is why they are not paying.”

“The answer of course obvious with all the corruption in these municipalities and with their money being squandered on excessive salaries and extravagant motor vehicles, the people no longer trust those in charge to use their taxes to their benefit.“Shicheka must remember that rates and taxes are not raised by a government to waste or spend as they please, they are payments for services rendered.
