SA on productivity index

“Much can be learned from the latest competitive index on which South Africa, already near the bottom, further worsened its position. South Africa now lies 52nd out of 59 countries on the index of the Swiss International Institute for Management Development,” says Christian Democratic Party (CDP) leader, Rev. Theunis Botha.

“What is even more concerning is that South Africa took the last position in the employment creation category. Also concerning is that the ANC, especially the Youth League, continues to see a country like Venezuela as a role model to be studied – whilst that country was dead last on the list.”

“In a very competitive global economy a country can not afford to have the reputation of being lazy. Such a reputation is especially unbecoming for a country where almost 80 % of the population say they adhere to the Christian Faith.”

“It is high time that government realises that the country will not create employment whilst courting disaster with their socialist aspirations.”

“Die lig word deur die jongste produktiwiteitsindeks gewerp waar Suid-Afrika vanaf ‘n reeds vernederende posisie nog verder die kreeftegang gegaan het. Suid-Afrika beklee nou die 52de posisie uit 59 lande op die indeks van die Switserse Internasionale Instituut vir Bestuursontwikkeling,” sê ds. Theunis Botha, leier van die Christen-Demokratiese Party (CDP).

“Wat nog meer kommerwekkend is, is dat Suid-Afrika in die werkverskaffingssektor die laaste plek inneem. Dit is ook kommewekkend dat die ANC, en veral die Jeugliga, voortdurend by Venezuela wil gan kers opsteek oor hoe dinge gedoen moet word, terwyl daardie land die laaste algehele plek op die indeks inneem.”

“In ‘n baie mededingende wêreld ekonomie kan ‘n land nie bekostig om sy reputasie as lui land gestand te doen nie. ‘n Lui reputasie is baie onvanpas vir ‘n land waar byna 80 % van die bevolking daarop aanspraak maak dat hulle Christene is.”
