**Closing arms deal investigation bad news for SA - CDP**

“Bad news seems to be the order of the day. The news that the investigation by the Hawks, into the controversial arms deal has been closed down; that the Department of Health, which is overspent by R2 billion, cannot account for R700 million; and that the AA is of the opinion that it will cost R100 billion to restore South Africa’s roads, with a mere quarter of the required amount being budgeted annually. This all comes on the same day.”

“Are South Africans supposed to get used to this, as is expected of crayfish being dropped into boiling water while still alive?” asks Rev. Theunis Botha, leader of the Christian Democratic Party (CDP).

“Yet, government office bearers continue forking out large amounts for luxuries, such as very expensive cars and luxurious hotels, claiming that they have worked for this. The President’s office itself, sets a bad example, by writing off losses of millions of rands. The Director General of Health’s explanation in reaction to the financial disaster in her department, is the usual: ‘We believe matters will improve next year.’

“We have been waiting for ‘next year’ for a rather long time now, and it still seems as though cadre deployment is an entrenched part of government policy. The list of where government is challenging or plans to challenge the constitution simply becomes longer and longer.”

“The final closing of the arms deal investigation will be a stain on the reputation of the country, and strengthen the perception that the ANC may not have invented corruption, only perfected it.”
