CDA reacts to ANC councillor's prayer remark

The Christian Democratic Alliance (CDA) reacted strongly to an incident in the Mangaung Council when an ANC councillor said God does not listen when people pray in Afrikaans. "It seems more and more as though the ANC is bent on subjecting the judiciary, Chapter 9 bodies and even churches to fall in line with ANC structural obedience, but trying to be prescriptive to the Lord takes matters way to far."

"In the same process yet another attack is launched on inter group relations, which is already under stress precisely because of irresponsible outbursts," says Rev. Theunis Botha, deputy chair of the CDA.

"Christians and supporters of other religions already had to experience repeatedly how matters on which they have strong beliefs, such as abortion and gambling, are simply subordinated to ANC ideology."
